# THEATER GROTTESCO PREMIERS SHORTS V: A NEW COLLECTION OF SHORT WORKS

*SANTA FE, N.M.*— Theater Grottesco's fifth collection of short works, *SHORTS V*, premieres in Santa Fe, Friday, August 27, 2010, 7 p.m.

SHORTS V, featuring a set made of 35 antique doors, is a production of original plays created by company members, each work a complete story and world unto itself. Theater-goers will see angels dropping from the heavens, lost whales, forlorn astronauts, murderer Gary Gilmore's last days, the largest storm in modern history and maybe even a surprise visit from God.

In Grottesco's fourth collection (*Keyholes – 2003*), two pieces eventually became full length plays: *Bolt Upright*, 2004, an Irish Ghost Story by Seamus Deane, adapted by Acushla Bastible and Charles Gamble, told by a band of buffoons; and *Grottesco's 12th Night*, 2008, a retelling of Shakespeare's *Twelfth Night* adapted by John Flax and told from the servant's perspective. *Keyholes* also included Elizabeth Wiseman's first full choreography: *River Rock Lullaby*; Rod Harrison's *I am Born to Preach the Gospel*, based on the character Hazel Motes from Flannery O'Conner's *Wise Blood*; *The Anniversary* by Anton Chekhov, directed by Kent Kirkpatrick; and Todd Anderson's "*Don of Ceremonies*." Performed in Santa Fe's CCA Warehouse, a spectacular venue renovated by the company for this production, *Keyholes* received the following notices:
