Girls Inc. of Santa Fe's 40th Annual Arts and Craft Show **Catering to Foodies**

Santa Fe, N.M.— 25,000 people will descend on the Santa Fe Plaza for the 40th annual Girls Inc. Arts and Crafts Show Food Court, Saturday, August 4 and Sunday August 5. Visitors will find a wide range of work by professional fine artists and crafts people. 60% of the artists in the show are from New Mexico and nearly half are from Santa Fe.

This event is the largest single fundraising event for Girls Inc. of Santa Fe and a successful event enables the organization to continue to provide programming which builds self-esteem, fosters creativity and promotes critical thinking skills for girls. No other youth agency in Santa Fe offers such comprehensive programming designed specifically for girls.



“Our goal is to promote this unique event to the local community, increasing the number of New Mexicans that attend the show,” says Melissa Glick, Development & Events Coordinator. “Because this show features the hand-made work of artists from Santa Fe, across New Mexico, and from around the country, you’re sure to find something you’ll love. Plus, our artists have something at every price point – from \$5 to \$5,000. While this Show focuses on arts and crafts and the artists that create it, there also is a wide variety of other activities for guests to enjoy, such as the Kids’ Creation Station, Socially Aware Santa Fe, and the new Food Court.”

“The Girls Inc. Arts and Crafts Show is the largest annual individual fund raiser for Girls Inc. of Santa Fe. We hope everyone will come out to support our artists and the girls of Santa Fe.”

Santa Fe has a vibrant community of “foodies” and superb culinary establishments. The food truck invasion is taking over America’s street corners. Girls Inc. is embracing this movement and is partnering with the High Desert Food Group to improve the food court. The food court will now feature eight high-quality food trucks bringing a fresh flavor to this 40th anniversary show. This year, visitors to the Girls Inc. Arts and Craft show will enjoy eight New Mexico mobile food vendors with a wide range of offerings including BBQ, wood fired pizza; Hawaiian shaved ice, New Mexican fare, burgers and more. There will also be several snack booths located in front of the Plaza bandstand with roasted nuts, local ice cream, aqua frescas, candy apples and kettlecorn.

In Girls Inc.’s efforts to go “green” at the Arts and Crafts Show, Good Water Company has become a sponsor and will provide free chilled water at a kiosk on the corner of Lincoln and Palace. The goal is to reduce plastic bottle waste by visitors bringing their own refillable bottle. In addition, Girls Inc. will sell Girls Inc. of Santa Fe BPA-free water bottles for \$7.
